

THE IMPORTANT STUFF, PLEASE READ:

1. It is the responsibility of all officials and competitors to ensure they have knowledge of the rules and comply with the rules. When you enter an event, you accept the rules and agree to abide by them. Breckland Carriage Driving Club runs its events in accordance with the Breckland Carriage Driving Club Rules and, where rules for competitions are non-existent, then the rules will be taken from the British Carriagedriving Rule Book or the FEI Rule Book for that event.
2. Handlers must have third-party public liability insurance which covers them for attending and taking part in this event. Members of the Breckland Carriage Driving Club are covered for insurance through British Carriagedriving at club events. Non-members must provide proof of third-party public liability insurance with entry. This can be in the form of a membership card for British Carriagedriving, a British Carriagedriving club, BHS Gold, British Driving Society etc. or a personal insurance policy covering equestrian activities.
3. Parents, Guardians and Carers are responsible for ensuring young and vulnerable people are kept safe at events. Young children must not be left unaccompanied whilst at an event (e.g. left in a horsebox alone).
4. Cruelty to or abuse of any animal (including dogs) by any person at an event is forbidden. Anyone found abusing an animal will be disqualified from the event.
5. Equines may compete in long-reining competitions from the age of 3 years providing they are at a suitable level of training. They must not be ridden or driven at the event, under penalty of disqualification!
6. Depending on the number of entrants, an equine may be competed by up to two handlers in a competition.

Equipment and Dress

7. Handlers must wear securely fastened protective headgear. Gloves recommended. Shoes should be sturdy and suitable for the arena surface, such as riding boots or equestrian trainers that are specifically designed for working with horses.
8. Competitions are open to ridden and driven horses.
9. Equipment may be either a driving harness with blinkered or riding bridle, or lungeing roller and riding bridle, with optional cavesson.
10. Bitless bridles permitted.
11. Unconnected reins must not be placed around the body. It is recommended that reins be of a suitable length to prevent coiling large amounts of reins in the hands.
12. Side Reins, not fixed, with elastic inserts or elasticated may be used. Lungie Bungie permitted.
13. A whip may be carried.
14. Boots & Bandages not permitted in Dressage tests.
15. Fancy Christmas dress permitted, but must be safe i.e. no dangling bits to trip over and no scarfs around the neck.

SHOW CLASS

The competition is judged on presentation and condition of the equine, fit and condition of harness/tack, and performance (walk/trot) during a short workout. Multiples permitted in driving class 1.

CLASS 1: Equine shown in full driving harness

CLASS 2: Equine shown in long-reining equipment

DRESSAGE - INTRODUCTORY TEST

Arena size 20m x 40m.

Long-reining Dressage is a competition that requires the Handler to demonstrate their skills for working the horse in long-reins through a sequence of movements, as in a ridden dressage test. Movements are predominately performed at the walk and working trot.

CLASS 3: Equine not exceeding 14.2hh

CLASS 4: Equine exceeding 14.2hh

REINMANSHIP

Arena size 20m x 40m.

A simplified long-reining dressage test where movements are performed at markers or between markers placed about the arena. Markers with RED sleeves must be passed on the RIGHT and WHITE sleeved markers on the LEFT. Like Dressage, scores are awarded for each movement. Movements are predominately performed at the walk and working trot.

CLASS 5: Equine not exceeding 14.2hh

FREESTYLE to MUSIC

Arena size 20m x 40m. Competitors may choose to perform any movements, including lateral movements such as shoulder-in, in sequence to demonstrate their handling skills and the obedience of the equine in long-reins. Must include a Halt and Salute at the finish. Judged on performance of the equine (straightness, paces, obedience) and ability of the handler (rein control, voice commands etc.). Maximum time 3 mins. Competitors must provide a declaration of intended movements in writing prior to the competition for the judge. Music to be provided on USB or CD. Fancy dress optional. **Special treats for all competitors!**

CLASS 7: Open Freestyle

CONES&OBSTACLE

Arena size 20m x 40m approx.

A fun long-reining competition to test the skills of the Handler around a course of cones and one marathon type driving obstacle. The competitor should aim to finish the course as close as possible to the optimum time, with 1 penalty incurred for every second started either side of the optimum time. 3 penalties for a dislodged ball. No timing device, including wrist watches, are to be worn by the competitor. Cones width set at 1.30m. Obstacles gates set at 2m. Speed 90 metres/per minute.
